C-Line Variation in Three Tribal Populations of Andhra Pradesh, South India

ABSTRACT C-Line variation has been studied among three tribal groups namely Savara, Jatapu and Koya Dora from coastal district of Andhra Pradesh. Out of all the C-line pattern types, ulnar type is found to be predominant followed by radial and proximal types. Bimanual and sex differences in these pattern types are found to be statistically significant only among Koya Doras.
