ABSTRACT This paper focuses on the factors and forces responsible for youth political ascendance in the oil producing areas of the Niger Delta region, with particular reference to Delta State. To enable us achieve this, we used the questionnaire, Focus Group Discussion (FGD) and the Key Informant Interview (KII) techniques, coupled with the secondary method of data gathering to collect data for this study.
