ABSTRACT Adjustment is perhaps the most fundamental postulate underlying all immigration programs. On arriving at the place of immigration the immigrants face an entirely new situation in which they have to undergo a long process of reorientation. They have to adjust to totally different patterns of behavior, new values and ideologies which may differ considerably from the ones they were used to. The immigrants try to put some order into the alien unstructured situation.
