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A Postmodern Historiographical Analysis of Alias Grace

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ABSTRACT Postmodern culture is a highly self-conscious culture which through its denial of the Enlightenment and modernity has brought about a maddening obsession with self-related topics. Atwood's *Alias Grace* deals with the issue of self and self-hood in a subtle way.
