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Introduction

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ABSTRACT Knowledge is the awareness and understanding of facts, truths or information gained in the form of experience or learning. It is an appreciation of the possession of interconnected details, which in isolation, are of lesser value. Several studies have pointed to the increasing significance of knowledge and indigenous knowledge systems (IKS) in sustainable development (SD) in Africa and the developing world in general.
